

## ACCEPTANCE OF THARRP TRAINING AGENCIES & COURSE EQUIVALENCIES

ADM<sub>3</sub>

**Purpose:** To provide consistent and fair credit for candidates/organizations with

diverse but educationally equivalent backgrounds/training agencies through the recognition of previous certified training. (**Note:** This does not impact any

current THARRP instructors.)

**Scope:** This covers the application of equivalencies within the framework of the

Technical High Angle Rope Rescue Program required to complete the training to qualify as a Technical High Angle Rope and Tower Rescue Instructor. This also covers tower crane update training for funded instructors after they have

completed 3 years in the THARR Program.

**Guidelines:** 

The following shall be used to determine the acceptability of training that would be viewed as relatively equivalent to courses within the Technical High Angle Rope Rescue Program.

#### **Training Agencies**

The training shall have been provided by an agency that has been certified by the Technical High Angle Rope Rescue Steering Committee, on an annual basis, that they provide Technical High Angle Rope and Tower Rescue training to the current National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standards.

**Note:** The Fire Chief is responsible for ensuring all training agencies and their representatives, employees and contractors are registered with Work Safe BC.

#### For Acceptance of THARRP Training

The Fire Chief will ensure that agencies delivering training meet current NFPA 1670 and NFPA 1006 Standards. **To submit prior training records, the fire department must log in to their THARRP Portal account, then navigate to Instructor management > Prior Training** and upload either a copy of the training certificate OR a filled-out *Fire Chief's Training Equivalency Sign-off Sheet* (See ADM3 pages 2 and 3) for review and acceptance by the *BCCSA THARR Program Representative*.

#### For Acceptance of Instructor Level Courses

Instructors shall meet a minimum of NFPA 1041 Standard for Fire Service Instructor Professional Qualifications or other applicable training as accepted by the THARRP Steering Committee.

#### For Acceptance of Tower Crane Update Training

Where a funded instructor has fulfilled their three year commitment **after completing training**, a department may elect to send the instructor to another Tower Crane training course for skills update.

**Update training is not mandatory.**
